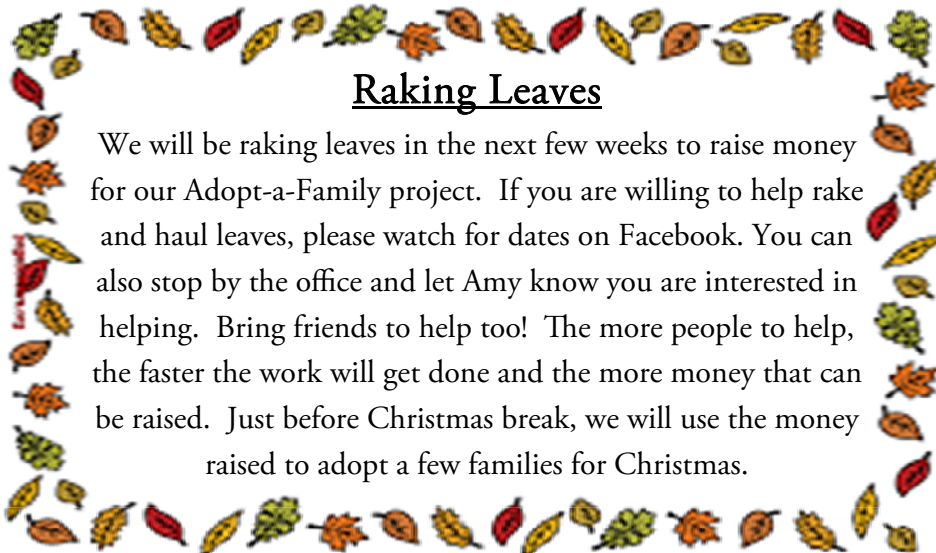

Christ the King Sunday

Deut 7: 13-14/ Rev1: 5-8 /  
Jn 18: 33B-37

Today we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. All three readings today describe, in some way, the kingship of Jesus Christ. Throughout the Bible, we are given many other images of Jesus: the Good Shepherd, the Son of God, the miracle man, the carpenter's son, etc. Most of these images depict Jesus as humble and peaceful. But Christ the King is different. He a mighty king, robed in splendor and he has received everlasting dominion and glory. It easy to get caught up in how AWESOME our king is, but He is still humble and peaceful at heart. He is a king who serves His people, and He wants the same from us. Jesus dwells within us, and His kingship is fulfilled when we serve one another. Serving Jesus as our king means loving Him with all our being, obeying His commandments, and caring for the least of his people.
